



***Public Works
2004 Bond Program Status
January 8, 2007***

The Public Works Department is managing over **\$30,500,000** worth of infrastructure projects, and assisting with nearly \$15 million of projects for the Fire and Police Departments.

Resurfacing \$8,320,000

Critical arterial streets in all 7 Wards were resurfaced in 2004. Local streets were resurfaced in Wards 1, 2, 3 and 6 in 2005. The contractor began the 2006 program in late March, and work was **completed Friday, January 5**. Additional resurfacing was completed with the \$150,000 provided from interest funds.



Drainage \$4,120,000

7 of the 9 drainage projects are complete. Eagle/Preston/Duval will be completed in January 2007. Swaggerty Branch is progressing very well. The sewer line relocation is wrapping up, and the project should be completed in February 2007.

Intersection Improvements \$2,415,000

Of the 4 intersections slated for improvement, all but the Chenal & Bowman intersection have been completed. Work on the remaining intersection should be completed by the end of January 2007.



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Traffic Signals

\$2,947,679

17 new traffic signals are operational. Of the 5 remaining projects, 2 are substantially complete and 1 will be completed in January 2007. The other 2 projects (FS #14 at Col. Glenn and Rodney Parham / I-630) have bid awards pending.



Sidewalks Near Schools

\$1,065,000

All 8 original sidewalk projects are complete. Only Forest Heights Middle School project remains of the additional projects. It will be completed in January 2007.

Street Reconstruction

\$11,585,000

Of the 24 proposed street reconstruction projects, 22 are complete or substantially complete. Taylor Loop should be completed in February 2007, and Kavanaugh should be completed no later than May 2007. One economic development project remains to be completed. New street light poles are being delivered for the Capitol Avenue Streetscape project which should be completed in January 2007.



Building Services

\$14,918,927

The Building Services Division of Public Works is assisting the Police and Fire Departments with additional projects totaling over \$14 million. These projects include renovations to fire stations, construction of a new emergency warning siren system, development of a fire training academy, and the provision of emergency generators at all fire and police stations.
